Residence Halls

How will attendees be assigned housing in the residence halls?

On the registration form, each attendee has the opportunity to list who they would like to room with during convention. Kiwanis staff will then assign the residence halls and rooms.

How are the rooms set up in the residence halls?

Residence halls comprised of suite-style rooms that share a bathroom. Each residence hall room is furnished with an extra long twin bed, dresser, desk, chair, closet and telephone. The other furnishings vary between buildings

Do we need to bring our own shampoo/conditioner?

Yes, attendees are responsible for bringing their own toiletries like shampoo, conditioner, soap, etc. You will also need to provide your own hair dryer as well.

Is there a washer/dryer in the residence halls? If so, how much do they cost?

There are laundry services in each building. The cost for laundry is \$1.00 per load for the washing machine and \$0.75 per load for the dryers. Guests should bring laundry detergent and coins in order to use the laundry facilities during their stay.

Is there a curfew, if so what time?

Summer Programs & Conference Services does not enforce a curfew for our summer guests. However, we do have Quiet Hours in the residential buildings which are:

Sunday – Thursday: 11:00 p.m. – 9:00 a.m.

Friday – Saturday: 1:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.

How is security set up in the residence halls?

Washington University Police Department (WUPD) is stationed on the South 40 residential area and routinely patrols the entire campus 24/7 by foot, bike, and automobile. Closed circuit cameras are in each residential building lobby. Residential building and room doors automatically lock and are accessible by swipe card only.

Do the residence halls have air conditioning?

Yes, the residence halls are air conditioned.

What is included in the linen package?

Linens are included in the registration rate. All linens will be in the room for you before you check in at the residence hall. Included in the package will be one pillow, a pillowcase, a lightweight blanket, two sheets, two towels, and two washcloths. All linens need to be

returned or the attendee will be charged a fee for items not returned. Extra blankets will not be provided.

Are there bathrooms in each room or are they community bathrooms (one per floor)?

There are bathrooms inside each suite. Four people will share one bathroom, similar to how you would share at a hotel.

Are the rooms going to be co-ed or same sex?

Each suite will be same sex and each floor will be co-ed.

Campus

Will CKI ICON attendees have access to recreation spaces on campus?

Pool – The daily pool fee is \$6.00 for adults and \$5.00 for youth (ages 2-12). The Millbrook Pool is open from noon – 8pm daily.

Game Room – The Fun Room in the DUC is open to all. Xbox, Wii, and other games are free for all to use in The Fun Room.

How does the internet work on campus?

Internet instructions will be provided at check in.

Upon check-in, guests will receive a password to obtain complimentary wireless internet all over campus (including in sleeping rooms, residential buildings, and the DUC). What about Ethernet? It is complimentary in the residence halls, but you will need to provide your own card.

Are there other people/groups on campus while we are on campus?

There will be other groups on campus such as youth soccer camps.

Will the tanning and nail salon on campus be open during ICON/LSSP?

The independent shops on campus keep their own hours and are subject to change.

Will we have shuttles that help people get to their dorms so that they aren't hauling luggage across the campus?

There will be shuttle service for certain hours of the day. Keep checking the CKI web site for more information.

Are we allowed to leave the campus as we wish?

You are not required to be on campus 24/7. We want you to explore St. Louis when we are not in sessions.

Where will we hang out in our downtime?

Check out Ursa's, the Swamp, the lobby's of the residence halls or any of the dining areas on campus. There is lots of space on campus for fellowship. The Campus Store in Mallinckrodt has computer stations and is a good place to visit to buy a quick snack, magazine, etc. The [Danforth University Center \(DUC\)](#) is a great place to hang out.

Here are some specific locations in and around the DUC which will be available for guests to visit:

1st Floor of DUC

Tisch Commons – plenty of seating for individuals and groups

Dains Dining Hall

Café Bergson – the café is a very vibrant area in the DUC which provides seating and has a flat-screen TV. Even when the Café is closed, the seating is still open

Orchid Room/Orchid Patio – an indoor and outdoor space with seating and fountains

Edison Family Courtyard – outdoor seating with umbrella-covered cedar furniture, stair-step benches, and rocking chairs surrounding a fire pit

South Patio – outdoor seating with rocking chairs

2nd Floor of DUC

The Fun Room – A billiards table, Xbox Games, Wii Games, and other arcade games are available and complimentary. The room also contains two 52-inch LCD screens with near surround sound.

Jane Goldberg Formal Lounge – features a grand piano and soft seating for a small gathering

St. Louis

How far are we from the arch?

Washington University is approximately 8.5 miles from the Gateway Arch in St. Louis. The Metro link can take you there for a small fee. For more information, check out their [website](#).

There are lots of great restaurants nearby in the area known as [The Loop](#). Delmar Boulevard is approximately 6 blocks from campus with dining, shopping and more! How does the MetroLink work? How much does it cost? Are there single tickets and day passes?

The MetroLink is the St. Louis metropolitan area's public transportation system. It includes a bus system called MetroBus and a light rail system called MetroLink. There is also a call-a-ride system for those in wheelchairs. Fares are dependent on what type of travel you will need. There are lots of options to choose from with fare passes. How are we getting from airport to campus?

Attendees are responsible for their own transportation to and from campus. The MetroLink will take you from the airport to campus. You will need to take the MetroLink from the Lambert International Airport, switch trains at the Forest Park-DeBaliviere station, and you are on your way to the Washington University stop called University City—Big Bend for US\$3.75! Fares and schedules can change at any time, so be sure to check the website for the most current and accurate information.
